

OBJECTIVES


- To enhance academic excellence through a diverse range of curricular activities.


A. CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES




BUILDING FOUNDATIONS:


IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-22

CONSOLIDATION AND INNOVATION

Curricular:

- To develop attitude, skills, emotional quotient and knowledge among the youth to understand their duties and responsibilities for serving the neglected and deprived sections of society
- To amplify the social and outreach activities and to be able to reach out and extend our support to the disadvantaged.
 - To inscribe the young hearts with ethics and moral values making them better citizens for a beautiful tomorrow.

THE PRACTICE: ACTIVITIES ARE CONDUCTED AT THE COLLEGE LEVEL



At the college level:

- The St. Vincent's students and staff conduct following activities and for HIV/AIDS-affected children and women every year.
- Our students, through the college committees of ALCUF and Vidyarthini Munch, annually organize a Bal Mela for children and women affected by HIV/AIDS at our college.
- Fund Raising activity is conducted every year by organising The Canteen Day every year wherein the students make food items and sell into the campus.
- They also donate food grains, old clothes, Toys, stationaries, toiletries for the Jeev Daan care.
- Drawing and painting activities are organized for children affected by AIDS.
- Games are conducted for these children, and prizes are given to encourage them.
- Students, along with their faculty members, visit the HIV Jeev Daan Care Centre at Lohiya Nagar, Pune and help for the food grains distribution.
- Once every fifteen days, a group of students visits the Jeev Daan Care Centre and nearby slums where HIV-affected individuals reside, building rapport with them.

EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:



1. Active Participation:

Students eagerly volunteer to join the organizing committees of ALCUF and Vidyarthini Munch, demonstrating their enthusiasm and commitment to supporting HIV/AIDS-affected children and women. Their willingness to take on responsibilities and contribute their time and efforts highlights their genuine interest in making a difference. Additionally, students brainstorm innovative ideas and themes for the Bal Melas, showcasing their creativity and dedication to creating memorable experiences for the attendees. Their enthusiasm translates into meticulous planning and execution, ensuring that the event is engaging, inclusive, and impactful.

2. Fund raising amount has been increased as the year pass by :The annual Canteen Day serves as an effective fundraising activity, with students actively participating in the preparation and sale of food items within the campus. The proceeds generated contribute to the financial support provided to HIV/AIDS-affected individuals through initiatives like the Jeev Daan Care Centre.

THE PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED

- Limited Resources: Despite increased fundraising efforts, there are limitations in the resources available for supporting a growing number of families in slums, potentially The leading to difficulties in meeting their needs adequately.
- Limited Diversity of Ideas: With only a select few students actively engaged, there was a risk of limited perspectives and ideas being considered in planning and executing initiatives, hindering innovation and creativity in addressing the needs of HIV/AIDS-affected individuals effectively.
- Difficulty in Sustaining Initiatives: insufficient interest from students made it challenging to sustain long-term initiatives such as fundraising activities or community outreach programs, resulting in inconsistency and instability in support efforts over time.





JOYFUL JOURNEYS: INSPIRING ACTIVITIES FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN AFFECTED BY HIV/AIDS



































The following activities and programs were undertaken by St. Vincent College of Commerce in collaboration with Jeev Daan Care Center for community service for HIV/AIDS patients at Lohiya Nagar.



1.AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

The college initiated a series of comprehensive awareness campaigns in collaboration with Jeev Daan Care Centre. These campaigns comprised workshops, seminars, and informational sessions conducted by experts in the field. Topics covered included modes of transmission, prevention methods the importance of regular testing, and dispelling myths and misconceptions surrounding HIV/AIDS.





2.COUNSELLING

Over the course of the years, the college established a partnership with Jeev Daan Care Centre to provide on-campus counselling services. efforts were made to reduce stigma by promoting a supportive and non-judgmental environment.





3.PEER EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The college trained a team of peer groups incollaboration with Jeev Daan Care Centre. These peer educators, received basictraining on HIV/AIDS prevention, transmission, and stigma reduction. They then conducted peer-led educational sessions, workshops, and interactive sessions. Peer educators also engaged their peers through social media and campus-wide events to raise awareness and encourage open dialogue about HIV/AIDS-related issues.





4.COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The college, in partnership with Jeev Daan Care Centre, launched community outreach program to reach underserved populations at LohiyaNagar. This included organizing health fairs, and Outreach efforts aimed to increase awareness about HIV/AIDS, provide access to prevention resources, and foster connections with community members to better understand and address their specific needs.



5.SUPPORT GROUPS



Recognizing the importance of psychosocial support for individuals living with HIV/AIDS, the college facilitated the establishment of support groups in collaboration with Jeev Daan Care Centre. These support groups provided a safe and confidential space for individuals to share their experiences, receive emotional and financial support. Trained facilitators led group discussions, organized educational sessions on topics such as medication adherence and self-care.



















6.FUNDRAISING EVENTS


